We pray for all who are sick, suffering, anxious and alone at this time. We pray for all NHS staff and all other who deliver care and essential services at this time.

DEAR FRIENDS,

Today we celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost, the end of the Easter Season. Mary and the Apostles, huddled together in the Upper Room, are transformed by the gift of the Holy Spirit and move out from the security of that room to proclaim the Good News to all creation.

One of the liturgical options for the Solemnity is to celebrate an extended Vigil Mass with four Old Testament readings (in the manner of the Easter Vigil.)

These readings help us understand what happens at Pentecost.

From the Book of Genesis we have the story of the tower of Babel. The pride and sin of humanity is thwarted by the division of language. Division is always a sign of the absence of God. This is overcome at Pentecost as all of those gathered in Jerusalem hear the apostles preaching in their own language. The Spirit gathers us into one.

The second reading from Exodus describes, in powerful terms, the manifestation of God to Moses on Sinai. The same power and strength are experienced at the descent of the Holy Spirit. The strength of the Spirit is seen in the good things brought through the Spirit. The Spirit's power builds up.

From the Prophet Ezekiel, we hear of the dry bones. That which is dead can be brought to life once again by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Lastly, the prophet Joel recognises that the outpouring of the Spirit offers universal access to God's gifts. There is no restriction on who can receive these freely given gifts from God.

God's promises to the people of Israel are fulfilled through the coming of the Holy Spirit.

The moment of fulfilment isn't a dim and distant memory.

It is always "now".

The Spirit is always available to us, if we have the courage to open ourselves up to his transforming power.

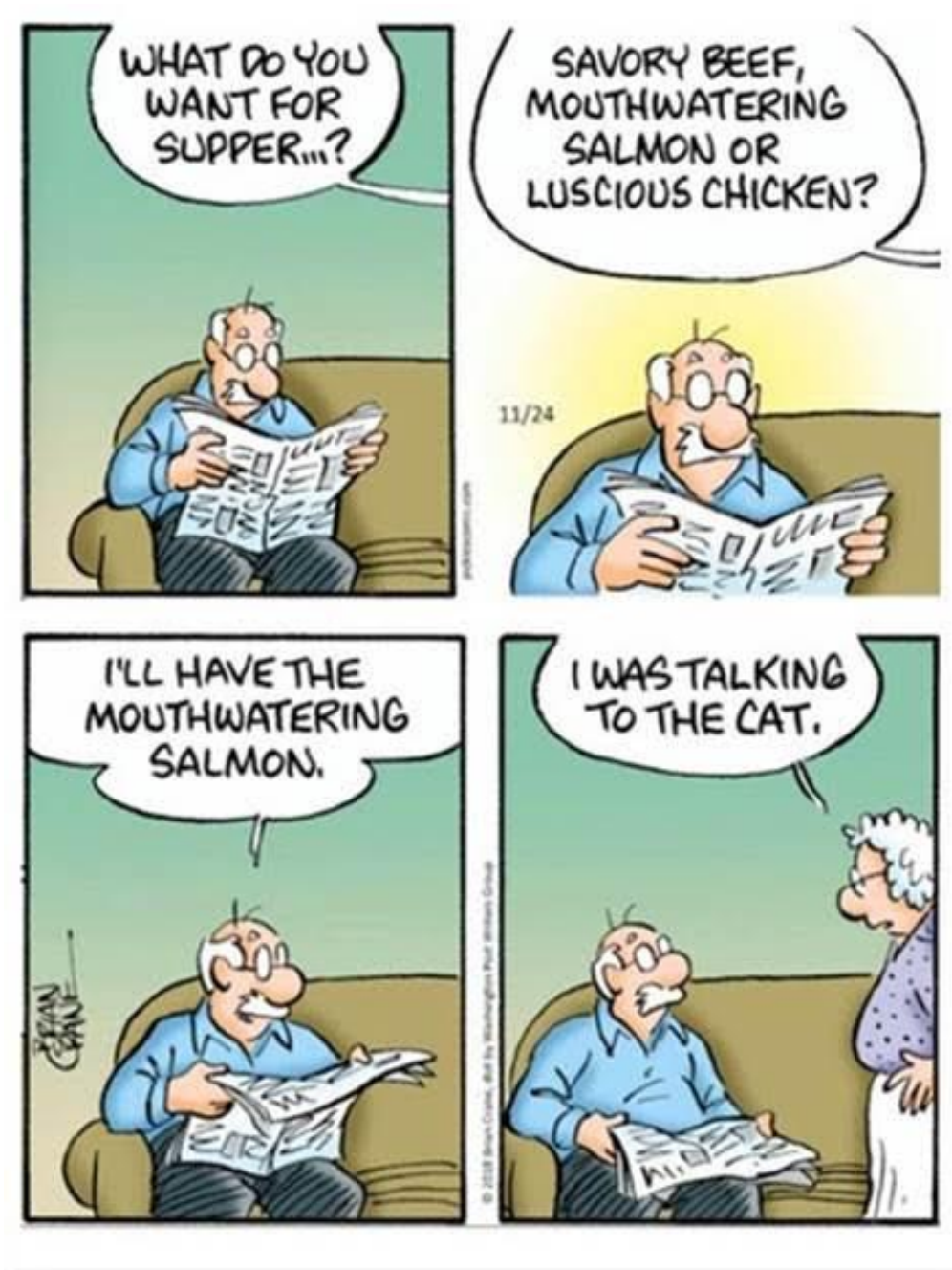
