DEAR FRIENDS,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. God isn't a stranger to us. He tells us about himself, showing himself to be a "God of compassion and tenderness, slow to anger and rich in kindness and faithfulness." As God's people wander in the wilderness, God never abandons them but leads them safely into the promised land. The people's lack of faithfulness leads them to a deeper understanding of the very essence of God, that is faithful love. This is reinforced in the conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus: "God sent his son, not to condemn the world, but that through him the world might be saved." Jesus reveals God most perfectly as being the God of love and mercy. Through God's revelation we understand that the very essence of God is a Trinity of Persons, whose relationship is love itself. The love between Father, Son and Spirit is creative and dynamic. It is not inward looking but spills over into creation itself. It's the outward looking love of the Trinity that brings creation into being in the first place; that love sustains creation and that love will make all of creation new. Let's pray for a greater awareness of God, Father, Son and Spirit, whose love sustains and renews us as it draws us deeper in.

Today was also the day chosen for the annual St Margaret pilgrimage. The little stone church that St Margaret caused to be built was dedicated to the Most Holy Trinity. She probably kept the dedication that the little Culdee Church had: the Celtic Church was so aware of being wrapped in the love of the Trinity. She is a great example of someone who is open to God's creative and sustaining love in their lives. It was that love of God and for God that inspired her in all that she did for our nation. Let's continue to pray for her intercession at this time and to follow her example of selfless love and care for our families and those most in need.

For the first time last year we began the Pilgrimage day with a joint service at Dunfermline Abbey. It was a great experience as we gathered together to share our common faith in Jesus Christ. We had planned to begin the Pilgrimage with a joint service and to invite the congregation of Holy Trinity Scottish Episcopal Church to join us this

year. Unfortunately, we can't do this physically but we have prepared an online joint service to be shared Sunday 7th June. I invite you to join with Rev MaryAnn Rennie and the community of Dunfermline Abbey, the Very Rev Kenny Rathband and the community of Holy Trinity Church on Sunday afternoon at 3p.m. The service will be posted on the Facebook and social media platforms of each congregation.

At this time, there is a weekly **ecumenical call to prayer on Sundays at 7pm.**


Thirteen Christian churches and organisations are taking part, with people urged to place a candle in their window at that time.
