DEAR FRIENDS

The speeches of St Peter that are recorded in the Acts of the Apostles aren't a verbatim account of what he actually said but present us with a distillation of his teaching.

The common thread that runs through them all is the call to repent.

It's not unexpected as it is a common theme in the teaching of John the Baptist and Jesus. We can sometimes think that repentance means focusing on our sins, and constantly beating our breasts as we express our sorrow. That leads us to get stuck in an unhelpful place, stuck in the past and unable to move forward with hope into the future.

The scriptural notion of repentance is not like that.

It means turning our lives around and setting out in a new direction, aligning our lives with the life of the Risen Christ, leaving behind the direction that I was going in and travelling in another. We look at the world differently with love, appreciation, and care, because we are looking at it with Christ's eyes. We live our lives in the light of the Resurrection, bathed in that light we can look at the future with confidence and hope.

From 26th April the 50-person limit for acts of worship will be removed as long as the 2-metre social distancing rule can be observed. This makes no difference to either of our Churches as we cannot fit in more people than we are already and observe the 2-metre rule. However, also from 26th April the number of people permitted at a "life event", such as funerals and weddings will increase to 50 people.



THE LAST WORD...

... FROM FATHER ISAAC

HE OPENED THEIR MINDS TO UNDERSTAND THE SCRIPTURES.

One unique thing about the appearance of Jesus after his resurrection was that each time he appears, he comes with different gifts and blessings. When he appeared to Mary Magdalene, he drove out the fear in her "do not be afraid" he said.

When he appeared to his disciples, he gave them the gift of peace thus: "peace be with you." He equally gave them "the power to forgive sins" and also "opened their minds to understand the scriptures".

Prior to the age of reformation, the Holy Mother Church hardly allowed anyone who was not trained in sacred scriptures to read and interpret it because of the vast and deep-rooted meaning contain therein. But with the advent of reformation, the Second Vatican Council encourages lay faithful to read the scriptures but seek clarification from experts where one is not too clear. In Act 8:26-40, the Ethiopian Eunuch was reading the scriptures but never understood anything until Philip the Apostle guided him. It is not enough to have the Bible or to read it, we need the guidance of the Holy Spirit or those who have been trained in sacred scriptures.

Up till now, the disciples had not yet understood what is written in the scriptures that the Christ would suffer and enter into his glory.

Today, Jesus bestowed the gift of understanding the scriptures upon his disciples. "He opened their minds to understand the scriptures." (Lk. 24:45) St. Jerome once taught that "ignorance of the scriptures is ignorance of Christ".

Peter in the first reading told the Jews that it was in ignorance they killed Jesus (Cf. Acts3:17-19)."None of the rulers of this age understood it, for if they had known, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory" (1Cor. 2:8).

Many a times we destroy those who come to help us in ignorance, we obliterate things that are meant to assist us, and we become helpless when we need help. In truth, illiteracy/Ignorance is a big disease. When one does not know the value or worth of something, one can easily destroy that thing. We have sometimes destroyed many people with our words and actions, we label them as evil those whom God has sent to help us. Let us guide against jealousy because it is the root cause of hatred.

In today's second reading, St. John says: "The way we can be sure of our knowledge of Jesus is to keep his commandments" (1Jn. 2:3) His commandments is that we love one another. Keeping his commandments makes us perfect in love and those who are perfect in love do not fear anything. They can say like the psalmist "Even if I should walk in the valley of darkness, no evil would I fear for you are there with me" (Psalm. 23:4)

Conclusively, it was prophet Hosea who said: "my people perish because they lack knowledge" (Hos. 4:6). We need to deepen our knowledge of God every day, in prayers, by reading the scriptures and by frequent reception of the sacraments. St. Richard of Chichester once composed a daily prayer which I recommend to all Christians: "Day by day, dear Lord, of thee three things I pray: to see thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, follow thee more nearly, day by day."
