DEAR PARISHIONERS

Something else that's different this year is the time when we celebrate the Chrism Mass. Traditionally, this would happen on the Thursday of Holy Week but this year it will take place this coming Tuesday. If you've ever been to the Chrism Mass in Holy Week you'll know that it's a beautiful occasion. On this day, all the priests gather with the Archbishop in the Cathedral and renew their priestly promises before him.

It's also the occasion when the Archbishop consecrates the oils for use in the coming year: the oil of the sick is used for the anointing on the forehead and hands of those who are sick; the oil of catechumens is used as a part of the exorcism that happens at every baptism; and the oil of chrism is used for anointing at confirmation, baptisms and ordinations.

This year there will be two priestly ordinations for our Archdiocese. The hands of the men will be anointed with the chrism to set them apart for all the sacred things that their hands will do - blessing, anointing, baptising and, of course, touching the Host.

Keep the priests in your prayers as they gather on Tuesday night, asking God to keep them faithful to their promises and to make them 'ardent but gentle shepherds.'

SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST

24TH JUNE

John the Baptist's birth commemoration comes 6th months before the birth of Jesus. A prophet, the first for 400 years, was the herald for the true Light:

And you, child, will be called prophet of the Most High, for you
will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,
to give his people knowledge of salvation through the forgiveness of
their sins.

Luke 1:76-76, the prophecy of Zechariah (The Benedictus)

O God, who hast made this day to be honorable in our eyes by the commemoration of blessed **John the Baptist**, grant unto Thy people the grace of spiritual joy, and direct the minds of all Thy faithful into the way of everlasting salvation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Tuesday night this week due to Chrism Mass.**

BOOKING FOR MASSES: It is **ideal** that you book a place for **Sunday Mass** - there may still be some places at some Masses for walk-in. In St Margaret's Mass is celebrated on a Saturday at 4pm and 5.30pm and on a Sunday at 8.30 & 11.30am. In Holy Name Mass is celebrated on a Sunday at 10am. Booking takes places on a Thursday afternoon from 3-6 p.m. For St Margaret's call 625611 for Holy Name call 07711703927. When you attend Mass you will be asked if you want to attend the following Sunday. If you cannot attend the following week the place will become available to someone else and you have to phone to rebook. If you wish to change Mass you must phone on a Thursday to ensure that this is possible.

Booking for weekday Masses is not necessary: just turn up.

Children's Anxiety and the pandemic

How to help your child journey from fear to peace

This Monday parents can receive practical and prayerful advice on helping their child deal with anxiety brought on by the pandemic. A free, one hour Webinar will take place at 7:30pm, led by Catholic educator Angela Dodds.

The event will cover:

- Common reasons/symptoms of child anxiety.
- Practical strategies for parents.
- Catholic prayer and spirituality for children.

Angela, a parishioner at St Cuthbert's in Melrose, has 20 years' experience working with primary children as a teacher and headteacher.

She has been helping children and families through the pandemic with 1:1 coaching and support for emotional and academic issues, has a diploma in Child Counselling and ran a school rated 'Outstanding' for Pastoral Care. The session is for parents of primary school-aged children.

THE LAST WORD...

... FROM FATHER ISAAC

WITH JESUS IN OUR BOAT WE ARE SAFE.

John Newton was a captain who used to carry slaves in his ship from Africa to America. He never worried whether slave trade was right or wrong. It brought him money; that was enough. On one night, a violent storm blew up at the sea. The wave threw up Newton's ship around like a toy. When everyone on board was filled with panic, Newton did something he had never deeded for many years. He prayed: "God! If you will only save us, I promise to be your slave for ever" God heard his prayer, the ship survived and Newton became a priest.

Later on he wrote one of the most popular and moving hymns: "Amazing Grace! How sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me" Yes, God who creates all things controls all everything. There is no situation no matter how chaotic it may be that God can not surprisingly create good out of it. It was when Job realised that God can triumph over all sufferings that he overcame his own suffering. (Job 38:11). Our realisation that God can do all things is the beginning of a turnaround in our life's situation. Not minding the state we find ourselves "for anyone who is in Christ is a new creation old things are passed away" (2Cor. 5:7).

In today's Gospel, the boat is the symbol of each one of us and of the church. The storm is the symbol of temptations and trials which each one of us has to undergo here on earth, while we are sailing on the sea of life and also the symbol of persecution which the church has to undergo.

The church, the bark of Peter, is often beset by storm. There have been periods in the history of the church when she has seemed other enemies as dying or dead. The undertakers were called in, the grave diggers were kept in readiness, but the church has always succeeded in burying both the undertaker and the grave diggers.

When the storms of life rage, only one thing we have to do: to wake up Jesus, pray to him, hang on to Jesus, shout, appeal and call on Jesus. All those who call on the name of the Lord will be saved (Acts 2:21; Romans 10:13). Jesus can calm the most terrible of tempest in our life. When the cold wind of sorrow blows let us turn to Jesus. We shall feel calm and comfort. When the hot wind of our passions blows let us again turn to Jesus. We shall find peace and security in the presence of Jesus. When the storm of doubt seeks to uproot us from the very foundations of our faith, let us turn to Jesus. We shall be safe. In every storm that shakes the human heart there is peace with Jesus.

Let us remember that as Christians, we get perished, we get lost, all our hope is lost without Jesus in our boat. But with Jesus in our boat, we are safe.

In truth, whether the storms we encounter be in our lives as individuals or as a church, be it in our personal life or in our Christian missionary work, we can triumph over it if we rely on the supreme power of God over all destructive forces.
