9TH AND 14TH AUGUST

This week sees the memorial of two saints who died at Auschwitz.



St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross was born Edith Stein in 1891 and is Co-Patron of Europe. Growing up in a Jewish family, she was a brilliant student and gained her doctorate in philosophy at 25. In 1922 she became a catholic and a Carmelite nun. Being both Catholic and Jewish, she fled to Holland but was captured and taken to Auschwitz where she died on the 9th August 1942.



St Maximillian Mary Kolbe was a Polish Conventual Franciscan who worked in the apostolate of the press in Poland and Japan. He was active in promoting the Virgin Mary following a vision at the age of 12 and ran an amateur radio station and temporary hospital at the start of the war. After refusing to sign the form to his German heritage, he was released but later arrested by the Gestapo. After offering his life for another prisoner, he died on 14th August, being cremated on 15th August, the Feast of the Assumption.


Reflection

Message from the Archbishop (from his last online Mass 1st August) following the reduction in covid protection level:

THE LAST WORD...

FROM FATHER ISAAC

THE BREAD THAT GIVES AND SUSTAINS LIFE TILL ETERNITY

There are moments of challenges and difficulties in life. Elijah had his experience when felt as if life was not worth living again. He cried out to heaven "This is enough, O Lord! Take my life." (1Kings 19:4) An angel was sent from heaven to minister to him. The bread he was given from prefigures the Holy Eucharist which eventually strengthened him all through his journey to the place of divine encounter. Likewise, the Holy Eucharist is our spiritual food as we journey all through life till eternity.

In today's gospel Jesus calls himself the bread of life that is the bread that gives life. This implies that there are breads that do not give life. The bread that Jesus offers is not so much bread that sustains us; rather it is the bread that gives life. To obtain the life of Jesus from the bread he gives, we must first believe in his word that he himself is in the bread. This is the believe and teaching of the church which she has never changed

According to Pope Leo I: "The effect of our communion in the body and blood of Christ is that we are transformed into what we consume, and that he in whom we have died and in whom we have risen from the dead lives and is manifested in every movement of our body and our spirit."

Thus St. Augustine says: "When you receive the Holy Communion worthily, you are what you've received."


Moreover, "The Son of God became Son of man so that the sons of men could become the sons of God."

Those who believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist will receive his life, which will enable them not only to bear life's trails, such as rejection by others, but also help them to reach out to them in love. The Eucharist enables us thus to get rid of all bitterness, all passion and anger, harsh words, slander, and malice of every kind, following the way of life as Christ loved us" (Eph. 4:31,5:2) Afflictions greatly lose their sting and the burden becomes easier to bear when we accept the life Jesus offers in the Eucharist.

A little boy once asked an electrician: "What exactly is electricity?" The electrician replied: "I really don't know, son. But I can make it give you light" Likewise, the Church may not be able to explain fully how Jesus is present in the Eucharist, but she knows he is present and he gives life to all who believe and all who comes to him.
