READINGS4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



FIRST READING Deuteronomy 18:15-20

I will raise up a prophet and put my words into his mouth

Moses said to the people: 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

Give your undivided attention to the Lord

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

GOSPEL Mark 1:21–28

Unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority

Jesus and his disciples went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the sabbath came he went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.'

But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

Annual Safeguarding Announcement 2024

My name is Rosemary Thompson and I am the parish safeguarding co-ordinator.
I have the annual safeguarding announcement from the Archdiocese to read to you.

At this time of year, we take the opportunity to talk to you about safeguarding. It is crucial that our parish communities are safe and welcoming places for everyone, and that children and vulnerable adults are protected. We do this by promoting a culture of care and ensuring that we have safe people, safe places and safe activities.

Within the Church we have a number of mechanisms which are designed to keep everyone safe. These include:

- A safe system of recruitment for clergy, religious, employees and all volunteers doing regulated work. This includes PVG checks, references and safeguarding training.
- A reporting system so people can come forward with any concerns, be listened to, and have those concerns acted upon.
- An annual safeguarding audit which informs safeguarding practice.
- A mandatory reporting policy any allegations are reported to the police.

There are many people and groups who work to uphold safeguarding standards.

At the parish level, the parish priest, safeguarding coordinator, group leaders and volunteers continually strive to ensure that safeguarding procedures are followed and our parish communities are safe.

At the Archdiocesan level, Monsignor Allan Chambers is the Vicar General for Safeguarding. Scott Mackenzie is the Safeguarding Advisor. Both are supported by a Safeguarding Officer (Elaine Anderson) and a Safeguarding Administrator (Margaret McCluskey), based at the Gillis Centre in Edinburgh and contactable by email or phone for advice. Their details can be found on the safeguarding page at archedinburgh.org, which is the Archdiocesan website.

The Diocesan Risk Assessment Management Team comprises of representatives including Clergy, and other individuals with professional backgrounds in Social Work, Police, Education, and Law. They meet regularly and advise the safeguarding team on risk management and good practice.

There is a poster at the back of this church with my details on it. You can also contact me if you have any concerns about a safeguarding matter.

Archbishop Leo Cushley, Fr Syriac and the safeguarding team in the Archdiocese are grateful for all the hard work done by everyone involved in safeguarding and especially the parish safeguarding co-ordinators and volunteers who help to ensure that the church is a welcoming and safe place for all. In doing so, we recall the words of Pope Francis who said: "everybody has the right to be safe and secure in our Father's house".
