With this in mind it was decided to form a small bereavement group to assess the response to this service. The group was set up towards the end of November 2023.


Who are we

At present we are a small group consisting of Kathie Whyte, Mike Robertson and Marianne Ellis. We hope that others may be interested in joining the group once we have a clearer picture of how the service is developing.

What do we do

At present we contact bereaved families on behalf of the Church . We clarify who we are and following some initial conversation, offer to visit the families if they wish us to do so, either at that time or at a later time to suit them.

We offer a listening / befriending visit and hope we can help people in some small way at this difficult time in their lives. In line with all safeguarding regulations we visit in pairs.



Parish Book of Remembrance

The names of the deceased are entered into the parish Book of Remembrance annually by Helen Doherty, one of our parishioners.

The Book of Remembrance is taken to the altar during the Mass for the Bereaved.

Many thanks are extended to Helen for for her meritorious service over the past years.

Mass for the Bereaved

Our first Mass for the Bereaved was held on 2nd November 2023. We contacted all of the families who had been bereaved in the past year to ensure that they were aware of the service as some of the families did not belong to our parish or live locally.

At the mass the names of those who had died between January 2023 to November 2023 were called out and family & friends were invited to come forward and light a candle in honour of their deceased family member.

Following this the whole parish community were invited to come forward to light candles in honour of their loved ones.

There was a very good response from the families we contacted directly and from the parish in general.

Plans for 2024

We plan to contact bereaved families to offer to visit them on behalf of the Church or to have a chat should they prefer to do so.

We plan to arrange a Mass and Candle Lighting Service for the bereaved each November.

READINGS 3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER



FIRST READING Acts 3:13-15,17-19


Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

SECOND READING 1 John 2:1-5

I am writing this, my children, to stop you sinning; but if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's.

We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments. Anyone who says, 'I know him', and does not keep his commandments, is a liar, refusing to admit the truth. But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.



THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

GOSPEL Luke 24:35-48

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread. They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!'

In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet.

Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.'

He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'
