Objective

The St Margaret's Parish Men's Group has been running in its current form for over 10 years. The objective of the group is to bring together the men of the Parish in Social and Spiritual activities.

Our Meetings

We usually meet on the first Thursday of the month in the Church Crypt at 7:30pm. We usually get 8 to 12 core members at our meetings. We have an informal social time of about 30 minutes before we start the meeting. Our meeting date / times are published in the Parish Newsletter. All men of the Parish are welcome to attend.

Our Fundraising

We are not a fundraising organisation. However, we often have a financial surplus from the events we run and we will make donations to local, national charities and respond to special appeals.

Our Activities

During Advent and Lent, we run weekly Reflection Group Meetings or participate in Parish run events. We will lead a Stations of the Cross one week during Lent.

Social Events

We run a number of regular social activities; for example a social evening at a local restaurant every two months, day trips, for example our last trip was to the Museum on the Mound, an annual dinner out with our partners, an annual golf outing and theatre trips.

Walking Group



READINGS 4TH SUNDAY OF EASTER – YEAR B



FIRST READING Acts 4:8-12

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today.

This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

SECOND READING 1 John 3:1-2

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are.

Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us.

My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is.

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Jn10:14

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me. Alleluia!

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Psalm 117(118):1,8-9,21-23,26,28-29

The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone.

GOSPEL John 10:11-18

Jesus said:

1 am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. 'I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep.

And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well.

They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd. 'The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.

No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
