SPOTLIGHT: READERS MINISTRY

The Ministry of a Reader

It is important to realise that whilst reading at mass the reader is actually participating in the Liturgy of the mass in the same way as the Priest, Servers, Eucharistic ministers and Music Ministries. It is therefore a privilege to read at mass because you are not just reading a story from a book but proclaiming the Word of God as part of the Liturgy of the Word before the Mass moves into the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

It is therefore beholden on a Reader to prepare for this privilege with prayer leading to an understanding of the text which will be offered to the congregation.

The Practicalities of being a Reader

Some readers are experienced public speakers so need little or no training. If a person does not have that confidence some training is needed. Most people need to learn the choreography of the Mass to enable them to know the timing of their approach to the Lectern and link in with the Cantor if there is one. Most new readers are surprised that although they may have been celebrating Mass for years they do not know when a reader "goes up"!

Old testament names are a common worry for new readers so some guidance is helpful. The Prayers of the Faithful are a particular challenge as they cannot be prepared at home unlike the Bible readings. It is necessary for the reader to check the prayers before mass begins particularly for none British names. This time at the Lectern is also valuable to check where on the page your reading is.

As the reader is proclaiming the Word of God to the Congregation in a large space, clarity of speech, voice projection and use of the microphone are important. The latter skill is particularly important at St Margaret's due to the acoustics of the building. There is no such problem at Holy Name as it is a smaller space.





The Reader Groups

The Parish of St Margaret's consists of two churches each with their own history and Liturgical requirements. There is a Vigil Mass on Saturday at 17:30 and 9:30am Mass at St. Margaret's (SM) and the Mass at Holy Name (HN) is 11:00am To service these masses there are three reader groups, two at SM and one at HN. Each church has a convenor who draws up and administers a rota which results in a person reading generally once ever four to six weeks. The rotas are planned for approximately 3 months in advance taking into account any dates unsuitable to individuals because of holidays etc. Last minute swaps are usually easily arranged as the groups have each others contact details. There are currently 11 readers at HN and 20 at SM.

There are slight differences in the way readers work at the masses due to the history of each reader group. For example at the SM Vigil Mass one reader is responsible for First and Second reading, the Psalm if no Cantor is available and the Prayers of the Faithful. The 9:30am and 11:00am have two readers sharing out the duties. There is a shortage of readers (particularly men) at the SM Vigil mass so on major feasts like Easter when a lot more readers are needed the Vigil and 9:30am pools are combined.

It would be good to extend this combined pool to HN readers so that they can contribute to the Major Feast days.

The Future

Readers do not go on for ever so there is a constant need for new readers to step out in faith and join the Reading Ministry. If after reading this piece you feel called to offer your service please contact the convenor for the particular mass you wish to attend to discuss further and give it a try.

The Convenors are Vigil David Hambley, 9:30am Carole McGuirr, 11:00am Barbara Whitlock. Alternatively Fr Syriac as first stop.

SCRIPTURE READINGS PENTECOST (B)



FIRST READING Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language?

Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'
