Sacrament of Reconciliation Is available on Saturdays after 10am Mass in St. Margaret's and on request at Holy Name.



ST COLUMBA'S RC HIGH SCHOOL

CARITAS MARKETPLACE WEDNESDAY 12TH JUNE 2024 - 10:50am to 12:30pm

WHAT?

The Caritas Marketplace will be an opportunity for the young S6 adults at St Columba's RC HS to connect with Parish and Community Groups, so that they can complete their 20 hours of service to our Faith Communities.

WHEN?

The event will take place in our school assembly hall on Wednesday 12th June from 10:50am to 12:30pm. We ask that volunteers representing the groups arrive at 10am so that they can be in position (or set up any materials) in time for the beginning of the event. All volunteers will be served with refreshments.

WHY?

Our S6 pupils will be working towards 'The Pope Benedict XVI Caritas Award', whilst simultaneously completing the SQA Leadership Award (Level 6), the SQA Religion, Belief & Values Award (Level 6), and the SQA Volunteering Award (Level 5). The 'Caritas Award' requires pupils to 'Learn' about Faith, put the Faith into 'Action', and then 'Reflect' on Faith. The 'Action' element of 40 hours is divided equally into 20 hours in school and 20 hours in their faith community. We are asking our communities to come in and help us make the connections with the young adults.

WHO?

All S6 pupils

You – the volunteers – from our parishes – our other faith communities – our local charity organisations

We <u>NEED</u> as many groups represented as possible – from:

Ministries (like 'Reading', 'Music', 'Eucharistic Ministry', or 'Altar Serving')

Administration (for example: 'Pass Keepers', or 'Communication Teams')

Faith Formation (for example: 'St Margaret's Learn @ Mass' or 'Children's Liturgy')

Charity Groups (for example 'SSVP' or 'One World Group')

HOW?

Pupils will be inducted into the Caritas Award and informed about the Hours of 'Action' required. Then they will visit the groups around the assembly hall. They will be expected to sign up to one group and select a 'reserve'. The lists of who can help will be collated and communicated to the groups in the communities. The pupils will then be expected to keep the contact active and complete their hours. A final 'comment and sign-off' is required from a lead person in the group.

All we ask is that you build a relationship with the young people and encourage them to use Faith as a means to 'Change the World'. Talk about your own reasons to giving up your time and helping others.

SCRIPTURE READINGS THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (B)



FIRST READING Exodus 24:3-8

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel.

Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.'

Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

SECOND READING Hebrews 9:11-15

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than the one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us.

The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed
