SPOTLIGHT: PARISH SYNOD GROUPS

Back in December 2021 we were tasked by the Diocese to respond to Pope Francis' request for our contribution to a Synod that was to be held in September 2023.

In January 2022 we issued a questionnaire and held several meetings in both St Margaret's and Holy Name. We submitted our response to the Diocese by the prescribed deadline.


A key outcome of convening our Synodal discussions was a desire by Parishioners to continue the dialogue we had started. To that end, we have created 4 groups that you, the Parishioners, determined would be advantageous to advance activities within our Parish Community.

Throughout 2023 the Groups have been formed and now meet on a regular basis. Shown below is a graphic representing the 4 Parish Groups and the sub-groups within the Parish that play an active role within the groups. Minutes of the Group Meetings are posted on the Parish website – we would encourage you to read them.

Some of the Groups have compiled a Vision, Values and Aims document that they use as their 'touchstone' – again these are available on the Parish Website.

These 4 Groups are now at the very heart of our Parish Community. They provide guidance to the Parish Council and actively support Fr Syriac in his pastoral work.

FIRST READING Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: the Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today, so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'

SECOND READING Romans 8:14-17

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.
