SPOTLIGHT: MOIRA MCCRAE

It was on last Wednesday morning we were given the very sad news that Moira McCrae, one of our fervent parishioners, gave up her brave struggle with illness and passed away for her eternal reward. For those of you who don't know Moira, she had been an inspiring presence of Christian charity among us. She was a longstanding member and eventual president of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul at Saint Margaret's.

Moira was no ordinary member. While she performed the typical duties of an SSVP member such as visiting the sick and lonely, distributing food vouchers and Christmas hampers for the less fortunate and organizing caravan holidays, she truly excelled when she took over the extraordinary task of the Fife Furniture Project.

This was a relatively local setup until Moira expanded it using her vast network of contacts reaching out to all Eastern Scotland from the borders up to Grampian and Tayside. Working from her two garages in Kingseat we were storing to the rafters, white goods, furniture, beds, toys, clothes literally anything that could go to a family or persons in desperate need of items most of us take for granted.

Due to the increase in requests Moira yet again using her contacts and determination moved the whole project into larger premises while also coordinating a hard-working team of SSVP members and volunteers in the process. These contacts also included other charities we provided with donations that were sent out to countries like Romania, Syria and Ukraine.

At the beginning of this year, taking in to account, these unmatchable and meritorious service to the poor, Archbishop Leo Cushley awarded the Archdiocesan medal of honour, to Moira and David Hunter (who was her best pal) for their outstanding ministries through SSVP. This was a great accolade, and both were very honoured, but Moira said nothing could ever beat the joyous look and thanks from the thousands of poor souls that she and her team helped along the way.

Moira will be sadly missed and the SSVP will be hard pushed to find another member of her strength, determination, love and kindness. Please keep her and her husband lan and all her family in your thought and prayers.

May her soul Rest in Peace!

SCRIPTURE READINGS 10TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (B)



FIRST READING Genesis 3:9-15

The Lord God called to the man after he had eaten of the tree. 'Where are you?' he asked. 'I heard the sound of you in the garden;' he replied 'I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid.' 'Who told you that you were naked?' he asked 'Have you been eating of the tree I forbade you to eat?' The man replied, 'It was the woman you put with me; she gave me the fruit, and I ate it.' Then the Lord God asked the woman, 'What is this you have done?' The woman replied, 'The serpent tempted me and I ate.'

Then the Lord God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this,

'Be accursed beyond all cattle, all wild beasts. You shall crawl on your belly and eat dust every day of your life. I will make you enemies of each other: you and the woman, your offspring and her offspring. It will crush your head and you will strike its heel.'

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture – I believed, and therefore I spoke – we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God.

That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Yes, the troubles which are soon over, though they weigh little, train us for the carrying of a weight of eternal glory which is out of all proportion to them. And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal.

For we know that when the tent that we live in on earth is folded up, there is a house built by God for us, an everlasting home not made by human hands, in the heavens.

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either – it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'
