New Lectionary

We would like to thank all our sponsors who generously helped us towards raising the funds for new lectionaries. As per the kind wish of the donors we are not publishing their names. However, the figures received over the last few weeks are shown below: £100, £20, £100, £250, £650, £1000, £20, £250, £650 = £3040.

The target was £1300; the amount raised was £3040; this created a surplus amount of £1740

This excess amount allowed us to purchase other essential liturgical items. Details of these expenses are:

2 sets of new Lectionaries (2 x 4 = 8 books) - £1182 (after the pre publication order was applied)

Books for various liturgical occasions - £360

2 sets of Altar Cloths - £750 (quotation - awaiting finalisation)

At the request of the donor, donation made to Our Lady Immaculate and St Margaret Church, Duns (Fr Isaac's church) - £650

The remaining funds (£100) will be used for liturgical purposes. Many thanks to all our sponsors. Their names will be recorded on the Donor Bookplates in the new Lectionaries.

"He who sings, prays twice."

St. Augustine

Christians have sung in sacred liturgy since the Church's earliest days. And the Jewish people have sung praise to God, in the context of holy worship, for thousands of years. The Psalms are the record of the liturgical song-prayers of the Jewish people. When we sing in the context of Holy Mass, we join a tradition of sacred worship that goes back to at least the time of King David himself. "Let us come before him with a song of praise," wrote King David.

Sacred music has a particularly important function within the liturgy of the Catholic Church. In the Vatican II document Sacrosanctum Concilium we find these words:

The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. The main reason for this preeminence is that, as sacred song united to the words, it forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy. (112)

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, the Church's guidebook for Holy Mass, reminds Catholics that "great importance should be attached to the use of singing in the celebration of the Mass... every care should be taken that singing by the ministers and the people not be absent in celebrations that occur on Sundays and on Holydays of Obligation."

When we sing, we experience God's presence in a new way. In 2003, Pope St. John Paul prayed that every Catholic, by "expressing their harmoniously and solemnly in song, experience its richness ever more fully and will abide by the commitment to express its impulses in their daily life."

May we sing together — in holy worship, and our homes - in praise and thanksgiving for all that God has given us.

SCRIPTURE READINGS 16TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (B)



FIRST READING Jeremigh 23:1-6

Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them.

Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks!

'See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The-Lord-our-integrity.'

SECOND READING Ephesians 2:13-18

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far apart from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law.

This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God: in his own person he killed the hostility.

Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, 'You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while'; for there were so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat.

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.
