Horizons of Hope

On the 4 Wednesdays of August from 7 to 9 p.m. in St Paul's Hall, Warout Road, Glenrothes, there shall be offered this series of workshops produced by the Canadian Bishops' Conference,, exploring our Christian understanding of how to live well until the end of life, and how to support the dying and their families. In the light of proposals to introduce in Scotland assisted suicide/euthanasia, we shall be exploring how palliative care takes a different approach.




Introduction

We completed the second running of The Gift Life in the Spirit course so it seemed appropriate to share some experiences of the attendees. This course produced by Catholic Faith Exploration (CaFE) is an inspiring and practical series aimed at people of all ages to help them encounter the Holy Spirit and empower them to share their faith.

Attendance

On average there were 10 attendees per session including the helpers. This was a smaller number than last year however the drop off rate was lower. It may well be that Friday is not a good day to run the course as for many people it is the start of the weekend. Friday was the only day that could be found in the Crypt calendar which gave a "clear run" between Easter and Pentecost. In 2023 the Gift was run during Lent and completed after Easter also a change of day was forced upon us due to parish use of the Crypt on Tuesdays. This resulted in the disruption of the flow and so attendance dropped off significantly after Easter. For the majority of attendees the second course was an old friend and when asked several said yes to the Holy Spirit, stepped out in Faith and helped with the smooth running of the sessions. Tasks included refreshments, registration, small group facilitators and prayer ministry.





Feedback

The Cafe style was appreciated as giving a warm comfortable learning environment. At the end of each course attendees were invited to anonymously fill in a questionnaire containing the following questions:

- What do you feel about the Gift?
- What do you think about the speakers and teaching?
- How helpful were the small group sessions?
- What was your experience of the prayer for Baptism in the Holy Spirit?
- What impact will this course have on your faith/church/ mission?
- Would you like to continue meeting?

Without exception over both courses the attendees enjoyed their involvement and found them rewarding. It was noted that the use of sub titles during the videos would be helpful for attendees who are hard of hearing, this feature is currently being incorporated within CaFE courses. The speakers were seen as ranging from too American to excellent but always enjoyable, challenging, enlightening and many other adverbs.

The small group sessions were greatly appreciated as we explored our faith and learnt from each other. Prayer ministry was for most a new experience and approached with some trepidation, however the Holy Spirit always gave peace and all were touched in some way. Impacts sometimes are not seen straight away but many attendees recognised that their faith had be strengthened, renewed, even bloomed and the Bible had become more relevant to them. Again almost without exception attendees had enjoyed the course and social contact so much that they would like to continue meeting. As a result after prayer and meditation a new course is proposed to start after the school holidays.

The future

Another course produced by CaFE & The Bible Society called The Big Picture will be run from August 27th. This is an inspirational Bible course helps people find their place in the Big Picture of Salvation History.

Each course attendee will have their own Book (which includes the DVD) and will be responding to Pope Francis who has said:

"The study of the Bible must be an open door for everyone" "Never just skim the surface of the Word of God!"

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.

GOSPEL John 6:1-15

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.'

There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves.

The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.
