SPOTLIGHT: SEASON OF CREATION 2024

Today we begin the Season of Creation, which runs from September 1 to October 4 and is a time for Christians to unite in praying and acting together to care for our common home. Today is also the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, which Pope Francis established in August 2015.

Theme and Logo for 2024

Each year there is a particular theme and for 2024 it is To Hope and Act With Creation,

and the symbol is The first fruits of hope, inspired by Romans 8:19-25

In 2015 Pope Francis issued his encyclical *Laudato Si*²: Care for Our Common Home, that invited the Churches, religions and all people of good will, to recognise the reality of climate change and take radical action to care for our fragile planetary home before it became too late. He warned of the dangers of minimising or denying the scientific evidence and thereby failing to take the bold decisions required.

The biblical image pictures the Earth as a Mother, groaning as in childbirth (Rom 8:22). Saint Francis of Assisi understood this when he referred to the Earth as our sister and our mother in his Canticle of Creatures. The times we live in show that we are not relating to the Earth as a gift from our Creator, but rather as a resource to be used. "Creation is groaning" because of our selfishness and our unsustainable actions that harm her. Along with our Sister, Mother Earth, creatures of all kinds, including humans, cry out because of our destructive actions causing climate crisis, loss of biodiversity, and human suffering as well as Creation's suffering.

The Christian family unites for this worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. It is a special season where we celebrate God as Creator and acknowledge Creation as the divine continuing act that summons us as collaborators to love and care for the gift of all that is created. As followers of Christ from around the globe, we share a common call to care for Creation. We are co-creatures and part of all that God has made. Our well-being is interwoven with the well-being of the Earth.

Our Parish response

1. Pray with and for creation

- A. Include a prayer of thankfulness for creation, and that we will protect our common home, in our daily prayers.
- B. "Pray with the news" or incorporate people impacted by climate or ecological issues into our daily prayer.
- C. Pray outside in the Garden, or go for a meditative nature walk to appreciate the gift of creation.
- D. Each week there will be dedicated bidding prayers for creation.



2. Nature Photography contest

Send us your nature photos that reveals the beauty and wonder of the creation, (with no people in the shot). It should be a RAW file with no editing applied. It should be captured by the contestant or one of her/his family members. Send the image on or before Sunday 29th September. All images will be uploaded on our parish website as and when they are received. Kindly send us a brief description about the picture: when it was taken, where it is, and who captured it. By forwarding this details you will be giving us a presumed permission to upload these details on our website together with the image you have sent us. Or rather, if you want to be anonymous, please indicate this when you send the picture. A team of experts will be evaluating the pictures and the best one will be awarded.

3. Place a plant/produce in front of the Altar

Bring a plant or a produce as a token of your gratitude for everything that you have received from God as the Creator. You may take the plant/ produce back after the mass on that day. You are welcome to do it on any of the 6 weekends within the season of creation (Aug.31–Sep.1, Sep.7–8, 14–15, 21–22, 28–29; Oct.5–6). Please let us know if you are intending to do so.

4. Lighting of Creation Candle

Different age groups will be represented in each week.

5. Thanksgiving mass for the Creation and Blessing of pets on Sunday 6th October

Bring an image of your pets, printed or on phone at masses (9.30am & 11am) on 6th October.

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SCRIPTURE READINGS 22ND SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (B)



FIRST READING Deuteronomy 4:1-2,6-8

Moses said to the people: 'Now, Israel, take notice of the laws and customs that I teach you today, and observe them, that you may have life and may enter and take possession of the land that the Lord the God of your fathers is giving you. You must add nothing to what I command you, and take nothing from it, but keep the commandments of the Lord your God just as I lay them down for you. Keep them, observe them, and they will demonstrate to the peoples your wisdom and understanding.

When they come to know of all these laws they will exclaim, "No other people is as wise and prudent as this great nation." And indeed, what great nation is there that has its gods so near as the Lord our God is to us whenever we call to him? And what great nation is there that has laws and customs to match this whole Law that I put before you today?'

SECOND READING James 1:17-18,21-22,27

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

GOSPEL Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves.

There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lipservice, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.' He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'
