Mission Sunday



SPOTLIGHT: Angelantonio Cascarino - A Man of Inspiration

Angelantonio (Tony) Cascarino was born on the 15th October 1934 in Davaar Home, Grieve Street, Dunfermline. He is the eldest of a family of 7, with 3 brothers & 3 sisters. Tony was a disabled child from birth. When WWII broke out the family were interned in the Gorbals, Glasgow, as his family were of Italian descent. Of course, in March 1941 Germany hit Clydebank with a blitz of bombs. The family returned to Fife and then lived in High Valleyfield from 1942–1955. As a disabled young boy, Tony's grandparents bought him a tricycle which gave him a great sense of freedom. The Headteacher at St. Serf's Primary was more than happy to accept Tony as a pupil there. When he left school, Fife council decided that the best place to continue his education would be at the Trefoil Special Residential School in Whitburn. Tony enjoyed many happy years there and STILL returns to the site to chat to the staff employed at the West Lothian council country park! In the summer of 1949 Tony, along with two other lads from the school, was chosen to represent Scotland at an International Jamboree in the Netherlands. This 'could' have been the pre-cursor to the modern Paralympic Games we see on TV today?

When Tony left school, he went to work at Valleyfield Colliery and then the family moved to his current home in Wedderburn Crescent in Dunfermline. When Valleyfield closed Tony became a road sweeper with Dunfermline Council. He also became shop steward with the N.U.P.E. trades union (to become UNISON) He also became Vice-President of the disabled section of that union.



Tony was also VERY active in the area of sport. He founded Pitcorthie Thistle Amateur Football Club and Valleyfield Sunday League team. He was given a special award by the council, along with Lindsay McDonald the Olympic runner, for his outstanding contribution to local sports. He was treasurer of Abbeyview Bowling club. He was a volunteer at the Commonwealth games in Edinburgh in 1970 AND 1986. He also worked at the Manchester Commonwealth games in 2002. Tony's charity work involved the SVDP, the Retired Section of the UNISON trade union and the Scottish Pensioners Forum.

Tony is also an avid Scotland football supporter, travelling to the games at Hampden Park, Glasgow through thick & through thin! When our Eucharistic Minister Kathie Whyte visited Tony at home the other week he gave Kathie photos & told the story of how the SVDP were sponsoring a group of young African boys at that time. In his effort to raise some funds for their project, Tony contacted the Scotlish Supporters Football Club at Hampden Park seeking some donations. To his surprise, they sent him a complete set of Scotland football strips which were forwarded to the boys for their team. I think we can see from the picture they were very happy with their gift! As he celebrates his 90th birthday let us all wish him all the choicest blessings from above!

Tony's story should be an inspiration for anyone, as much of it has been spent in the service of others.

THE ROSARY

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7. It was instituted to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The purpose of the Rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Praying the Hail Mary reminds us that we are joining with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. In addition, they help to make us aware that Mary was and is still intimately joined with her son, Jesus, in all the mysteries of earthly and heavenly existence. The constant repetition of prayer creates an atmosphere of contemplation. In 1569, the papal bull Consueverunt Romani Pontifices by the Dominican Pope Pius V officially established the devotion to the Rosary in the Catholic Church.

How to Pray the Rosary

The Rosary is divided into five groups of ten beads called decades. As we pray the rosary we meditate on the events of Our Lord's life and Passion, which are called Mysteries. The repetition of the prayers assists in this prayerful meditation. The rosary, in essence, is a compendium of the Gospel and leads us, through the intercession of Our Lady, to contemplate Jesus Christ.

Begin by praying the Sign of the Cross.

- 1.On the crucifix pray the Apostles Creed.
- 2. Begin the rosary with 1 Our Father.
- 3. Pray 3 Hail Mary's for an increase in the virtues of faith, hope, and love, and follow with a Glory Be.
- 4.Next, you will begin to pray the Mysteries, or decades, of the Rosary. It is suggested you focus on the mysteries according to the day of the week you are praying.

4a. Announce the first mystery (Ex: "The first Joyful Mystery is the Annunciation.")

4b. Pray 1 Our Father

- 1. Follow with 10 Hail Mary's for each of the 10 beads in the decade
- 2.5a. After, pray 1 Glory Be
- 3.5b. Conclude the decade with the Fatima Prayer
- 4. Repeat all of step 4 to begin the 2nd decade.
- 5. Repeat all of step 5 to finish the 2nd decade.
- 8-13. Repeat steps 4 and 5 for the remaining 3 decades.
 - 1.Lastly, pray the Hail Holy Queen and the concluding prayer.
