SCRIPTURE READINGS 31ST SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (B)



FIRST READING Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord the God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: the Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

SECOND READING Hebrews 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

The Word of the Lord Thanks be to God One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these. The scribe said to him, Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice. Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, You are not far from the kingdom of God. And after that no one dared to question him any

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

Memorial Pebbles

White pebbles and permanent markers will be available at the entrance of the church. You may pick up a pebble and inscribe the name/names of your deceased ones irrespective of their parish or denomination or any other specifications, and drop it in the designated basket which will be located at the altar steps. These will be placed in the Memorial garden towards the end of November.

The Book of Remembrance

The Book of Remembrance which contains the name of the Deceased of the Parish will be carried in the Offertory procession on Sundays in November.

Holy Mass and Candle Service for the Deceased

A sacred time to remember and pray for our deceased, especially those who passed away between November 2023 to November 2024 and light a candle for them in front of the altar. All will get the opportunity to light a candle for their beloved ones. This service will be held on Thursday 7th of November 7pm at St Margaret's and Sunday 17th November at 11am at Holy Name.

Remembrance Sunday

On Sunday 10th November we will commemorate the great sacrifice of those who have lost their lives in war. They will be remembered during the mass and a poppy wreath will be laid at the altar steps.
