Sunday Morning Car Parking – Important Notice

We've seen a rise in inconsiderate parking on Sunday mornings, creating serious health and safety concerns. Please help us keep everyone safe by following these guidelines:

- Park only within the marked white bays or in the temporary car park area (between the wooden slats).
- Do not park in any other areas—especially outside the designated zones.
- Emergency vehicles and the free bus service require clear access at all times. Improper parking may block them.

If the car park is full, please use Viewfield Car Park directly opposite the church. It's free until 1pm on Sundays. Thank you to our passkeepers who help ensure safety for all.

• Please note: In particular the area directly in front of the main entrance MUST remain clear at all times.

HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS 1936 - 2025

On Monday 21st April, The Vatican announced the death of Pope Francis at the age of 88.

The funeral of Pope Francis takes place at 9am (UK) this Saturday in St Peter's Square. Bishop John Keenan, as President, will represent the Bishops' Conference of Scotland.

Pope Francis will be fondly remembered in our weekend masses.

"I am deeply saddened to hear of The Holy Father's death. He shared Christ's mercy and compassion to all, especially the poor and the vulnerable. He emphasised our duty to protect God's creation for future generations and he worked tirelessly, to seek unity in a divided world.

Through the synods held during his Pontificate he wished us to learn again to listen to each other as children of God and heirs to the same life of grace. He called for peace on earth: may the living Lord now grant him the peace of eternal rest."

"Just as we need the courage to be happy, we also need the courage to live simply."

"Let us not be satisfied with a mediocre life. Be amazed by what is true and beautiful, what is of God!"

"The measure of the greatness of a society is found in the way it treats those most in need, those who have nothing apart from their poverty!"

"Embrace with tender affection the whole of humanity, especially the poorest, the weakest, the least important."

"Holiness doesn't mean doing extraordinary things, but doing ordinary things with love and faith."

"The perfect family doesn't exist. A healthy family life requires frequent use of three phrases: 'May I?' 'Thank you,' and 'I'm sorry.'

"Migrants and refugees are not pawns on the chessboard of humanity. They are children, women, and men who leave or who are forced to leave their homes for various reasons, who share a legitimate desire for knowing and having, but above all for being, more."

"I prefer a church which is bruised, hurting, and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security."

A quote from Pope Francis's final public speech, his address on Easter Sunday:

"What a great thirst for death, for killing, we witness each day ... How much violence we see, often even within families, directed at women and children! How much contempt is stirred up at times toward the vulnerable, the marginalized, and migrants!

On this day, I would like all of us to hope anew and to revive our trust in others, including those who are different than ourselves, or who come from distant lands, bringing unfamiliar customs, ways of life and ideas! For all of us are children of God!"

FIRST READING Acts 5:12-16

Many signs and wonders were regularly done among the people by the hands of the Apostles. And they were all together in the Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high esteem. And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes of both men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets and laid them on cots and mats, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them.

The people also gathered from the towns round Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed.

SECOND READING Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19

I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet saying, 'Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches.'

Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash round his chest. When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, 'Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive for evermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Psalm 118(117):2-4. 22-24. 25-27a. Ř1 Give praise to the Lord for he is good, his mercy endures for ever. GOSPEL ACCLAMATION John 20:29 Alleluia, alleluia. You believed, Thomas, because you have seen me, says the Lord. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed. Alleluia.

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.

God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen. GOSPEL John 20:19-31

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.'

Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord'. But he said to them, 'Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe.'

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.
