SPOTLIGHT: THE WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

"Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (Sirach 14:2)

Pope Francis instituted the **World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly** in 2021 to highlight the unique role of older generations within families, the Church, and society. This annual celebration is held on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. The theme for the Fifth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly (Sunday, July 27, 2025) is "Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (Sirach 14:2). This theme is chosen in the context of the Jubilee of Hope 2025.

The establishment of this day reflects the Church's long-standing attention to the elderly, recognising them as a "great treasure" from human, social, religious, and spiritual perspectives.

Pope John Paul II highlighted the Church's respect for the elderly, their dedication, and spirituality.

Pope Benedict XVI emphasised that grandparents should never be excluded from the family circle, viewing them as a treasure for younger generations, especially in their witness of faith.


Pope Francis has repeatedly urged young people to stay close to their grandparents, emphasising that their existence is like an open book offering valuable advice for life.

Pope Leo XIV encourages the elderly to press forward with confidence in the Lord and to be renewed daily through encounter with Him in prayer.

Grandparents are often the primary channels for passing down important values and initiating grandchildren into the Christian life. Their words, affection, and presence help children understand that history precedes them, connecting them to an age-old pilgrimage and fostering respect for what came before. In many secularised societies, grandparents are an indispensable link in educating children and young people in the faith that parents may lack.

Old age is not an end, but a gift and a mission—a true vocation from the Lord. The elderly are called to live old age with wisdom, rediscovering the meaning of their Baptism and their relationship with God. They are encouraged to be privileged witnesses of God's faithful love and missionaries themselves.

In essence, the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is a call to recognise, honour, and integrate the wisdom, experience, and faith of older generations into the fabric of family, Church, and society, fostering a deeper appreciation for their unique contributions and ensuring their well-being.

O God, Father of mercies, we thank you for the gift of life and for the blessing of being part of your family. We thank you for our grandparents and the elderly, who, with their wisdom and experience, enrich our lives and our communities.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR (C)



FIRST READING Genesis 18:20-32

In those days: The Lord said, 'Because outcry against Sodom Gomorrah is great and their sin is very grave, I will go down to see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me. And if not, I will know.' So the men turned from there and went towards Sodom, but Abraham still stood before the Lord.

Then Abraham drew near and said, 'Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city. Will you then sweep away the place and not spare it for the fifty righteous who are in it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to put the righteous to death with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?' And the Lord said, 'If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will spare the whole place for their sake.' Abraham answered and said, 'Behold, I have undertaken to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes. Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking. Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?' And he said, 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there.' Again he spoke to him and said, 'Suppose forty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of forty I will not do it.' Then he said, 'Oh let not the Lord be angry, and I will speak. Suppose thirty are found there.' He answered, 'I will not do it, if I find thirty there.' He said, 'Behold, I have undertaken to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it.' Then he said, 'Oh let not the Lord be anary, and I will speak again but this once. Suppose ten are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of ten I will not destroy it.'

SECOND READING Colossians 2:12-14

Brothers and Sisters: You have been buried with Christ in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God who raised him from the dead. And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, by cancelling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Romans 8:15bc Alleluia, alleluia. You have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, 'Abba! Father!' Alleluia.

GOSPEL Luke 11:1-13

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.' And he said to them, 'When you pray, say: 'Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation.'

And he said to them, 'Which of you who has a friend will go to him at midnight and say to him, "Friend, lend me three loaves, for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey and I have nothing to set before him"; and he will answer from within, "Do not bother me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed. I cannot get up and give you anything"? I tell you, though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his impudence he will rise and give him whatever he needs. And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed
