Sea Sunday

This weekend contains Sea Sunday, the annual time when we remember the estimated 1,500.000 active seafarers around the world who work constantly and tirelessly to bring us over 90% of our daily needs from food to fuel, from cars to clothing. These seafarers, from many nations, are rarely seen by us but are our invisible and indispensable friends as they sail from port to port, loading and unloading goods of all descriptions. Their work is often arduous and dangerous. It takes them away from homes and families. They work on contracts with worldwide companies where they have only basic employment protections, which are frequently breached. There are three main Christian international charities which actively support these men and women with the many problems that they may encounter whilst onboard merchant ships of all flags. Our own very active Catholic charity is The Apostleship of the Sea, known generally as Stella Maris. It was founded over a century ago at the beautiful church of St Aloysius in Glasgow and has since spread worldwide. Here in Fife we have ports in constant use in Methil, Kirkcaldy, Burntisland, Braefoot Bay, Inverkeithing and Rosyth. Co-ordinating with the Mission to Seafarers and Sailors Society our chaplains and volunteer ship visitors serve visiting seafarers from our joint centre in Grangemouth helping them to maintain contact with their families and with many other personal tasks; no task is too difficult. If it is possible for you to donate to Stella Maris through today's collection it would be very much appreciated. SPOTLIGHT: PARISH REGISTER

Why be on the parish register?

- You will have a much better idea of what is happening in our parish.
- With better communication, everyone feels more connected and included, which really strengthens our community.
- It helps us find people who want to share their skills and time, making it easier for more folks to get involved in parish life.
- Keeping the register up-to-date makes planning and organizing things like events and volunteer work a whole lot simpler.
- It helps us welcome new members and make sure they feel connected and in the loop right from the start.
- All information on the registration form will be kept within the confines of St Margaret's Parish and not divulged to third parties the Archdiocese does not have access.

How are we doing six months in?

- There are now 411 parishioners on the register. The figure on the 1st February was 79, on the 1st May was 382 and the 1st June was 403. As the parish records prior to the register are incomplete it is not possible to say what the total number of parishioners is currently but it is safe to say most active churchgoers are now on the register. Registration is a process and not a one-off event, so parishioners are asked to encourage those yet to register to do so forms are available at the back of both churches.
- The email function is now working properly with birthday messages going out to parishioners on their birthday from Father. It was also used to remind parishioners of the Pilgrimage arrangements prior to the event.
- The text facility is operational but will only be used when communication has to be immediate for example if a Mass/service has to be cancelled at short notice.



Parish Demographics

Future plans/developments for the register

- Children are currently not on the register but that is an option for the future.
- Personal greetings from Father extended to parishioners with other celebrations e.g. families of First Communicants. Personal message marking the anniversary of a relative passing. Congratulatory message on a wedding anniversary. This information could also be included in the newsletter (with permission).
- Communication with groups within the parish specifically without a general communication going out to everyone.
- Particular campaigns targeting groups e.g. promoting Gift Aid for taxpayers.
- Holy Name is piloting dissemination of the agenda for its Steering Group meetings via the register allowing parishioners to suggest items for discussion. In the future the minutes of these meetings may be emailed to parishioners keeping everyone informed of decisions made. This will be considered by the Parish Pastoral Council.

FIRST READING Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses spoke to the people: 'Obey the voice of the Lord your God, keep his commandments and his statutes that are written in this Book of the Law, turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

'For this commandment that I command you today is not too hard for you, neither is it far off. It is not in heaven, that you should say, "Who will ascend to heaven for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?" Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, "Who will go over the sea for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?" But the word is very near you. It is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can do it.'

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed

At that time: Behold, a lawyer stood up to put Jesus to the test, saying, 'Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? How do you read it?' And he answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' And he said to him, 'You have answered correctly; do this, and you will live.'

But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him and departed, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was, and when he saw him, he had compassion. He went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he set him on his own animal and brought him to an inn and took care of him. And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, "Take care of him, and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back." Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbour to the man who fell among the robbers?' He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' And Jesus said to him, 'You go, and do likewise.'
