My Dearest Parishioners,

The universal Church is currently engaged in a process of reflection and renewal through the recommendations and deliberations of the Synod on Synodality, a journey initiated by Pope Francis.

Liturgical Ministries – Enhance our worship by serving as lectors, welcomers, altar servers, members of the choir, florists, cleaners, etc. Your service helps create a prayerful and welcoming environment for all who gather.

Catechetical Programs - Share your faith with the next generation by becoming a catechist for our children's liturgy or assisting with sacramental preparation programs.



18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR (C)



FIRST READING Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23

Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

Sometimes a person who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave everything to be enjoyed by someone who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. This also is vanity.

SECOND READING Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Brothers and Sisters: If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator.
