
St Pier Giorgio Frassati book tour

A Tribute to a Lifetime in the Priesthood and in the Order of Preachers for Fr. Aelred Connelly (John)

Reaching a milestone such as 40 years in the Priesthood is a testament to unwavering faith, steadfast commitment, and a life devoted to service. On the 18th October 2025 we will gather in gratitude and admiration to honour a remarkable journey that has been shaped by prayer, learning, compassion, and a tireless dedication to sharing the Good News.

The Journey

John was born on 7 November 1953. He attended Holy Name Primary and St Andrew's High Kirkcaldy. After two years at Blairs Seminary he studied for two more years at Scots College, Rome. From 1974–78 he studied history at the University of Edinburgh before moving to Drygrange in the period 1978–80. In 1980 he joined the Dominican Order where he made his Simple Profession on 14th November 1981. John was ordained as a priest in The Mercy Convent Lauriston in Edinburgh on 19th October 1985 and celebrated his first Mass in Holy Name on Sunday 20th. Between the years of 1983 –1986 John studied at New College in Edinburgh and gained a Bachelor of Divinity degree.

John's Dominican ministry has, since ordination, taken him to Oxford, London, Leicester, Glasgow and Edinburgh. He has been student chaplain at Strathclyde University, Leicester University and De Montford University. He was chaplain at the Royal Free Hospital London. John has worked with prisoners in Wormwood Scrubs and Polmont Young Offenders Institution. He is currently based at St Albert the Great's Church in Edinburgh.

From the moment he answered the call to join the Order of Preachers, his life became a living witness to the Dominican spirit. Through times of joy and challenge alike, his devotion to the path of Saint Dominic has shone as a beacon for all who have had the privilege to know him.

Teaching, Preaching, and Guiding

His vocation has not been a solitary one. Over four decades, he has embraced the Dominican mission: to contemplate and to share the fruits of contemplation. Whether from the pulpit, in work situations, or through the gentle guidance of a listening ear, his words and actions have touched countless lives. He has been a faithful preacher, a wise teacher, and a compassionate guide, gently leading others towards truth and light. John has always acknowledged the example set by his parents, John and Helen. He has always played an important and supportive role in his family as a brother to Kevin and Marie, brother-in-law to Barbara and Michael, Uncle to Anne-Marie, Rebecca and Josh and Great Uncle to Aidan.

A Pillar of the Community

Within his community, his presence has been a source of strength and encouragement. His kindness, humility, and patience have uplifted fellow brothers and sisters, fostering unity and a sense of belonging. The generosity of spirit he has shown extends beyond the walls of any one house or parish, reaching all whose lives intersect with his.

Legacy of Love and Service

As we celebrate this extraordinary milestone, we give thanks for the legacy he continues to build. His example encourages us all to live with greater faith, hope, and love. The seeds he has planted over forty years now bear fruit in the lives of those he has taught, counselled, and accompanied on their own journeys.

On this special occasion, we pray that John may be blessed with continued health and joy in your service. May he find deep satisfaction in all he has given and all he has become. Thank you for his forty years of tireless devotion, for his courage to preach the truth, and for his generous heart that has enriched our community and the wider Church.



27TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR - YEAR (C)



FIRST READING Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not hear? Or cry to you 'Violence!' and you will not save? Why do you make me see iniquity, and why do you idly look at wrong? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise.

THE NICENE ("Niceno-Constantinopolitan") Creed
