

SPOTLIGHT: SEASON OF ADVENT

Each week, during the season of advent, we will be reflecting on themes and scripture as we prepare for the celebration of the birth of Lord Jesus Christ.

Advent week 3: Joy in Reconciliation

This week we consider how the Old Testament relates how The Fall impacted the descendants of Adam and Eve and how they worked to reconcile their differences to be closer to God.

God sent his Son to save us from sin, and He stands at the door to our hearts, waiting for us to open it. We can repair the damage caused by sin through examining our conscience (e.g. review the Ten Commandments, Beatitudes), confessing our sins and, receiving absolution and penance as we are healed through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



Adam & Eve

Because Adam and Eve ate the fruit off the tree that God commanded them not to eat from, they are banished from the garden. Exiled. They ate from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, and now they are cut off from the tree of life. (Genesis 3)

Jacob

In Genesis 28, we hear how Jacob had a vision from God, reiterating the promise He made with Abraham and that he would be with him in the future. This may appear as a surprise following the events in Genesis 25, but it shows the depth of God's forgiveness.





Joseph

The story of Joseph shows many layers of forgiveness following the actions of his brothers (Genesis 37:3–33) and their reconciliation in Egypt (Genesis 43–46).

David

David as king faced many challenges and questionable choices but managed to reconcile his differences with God and instigated the Psalms of praise for His mercy. (2 Samuel 2, 5, 7; Psalms incl. 23, 145). He was the first - but not the only - shepherd-King.





Elijah

Elijah was a prophet tasked by God to reconcile a nation back to him. Through God's demonstration (1 Kings 18:17-39) we learn of the power of action and then the joy when Elijah met God in the peace (1 Kings 19).
