

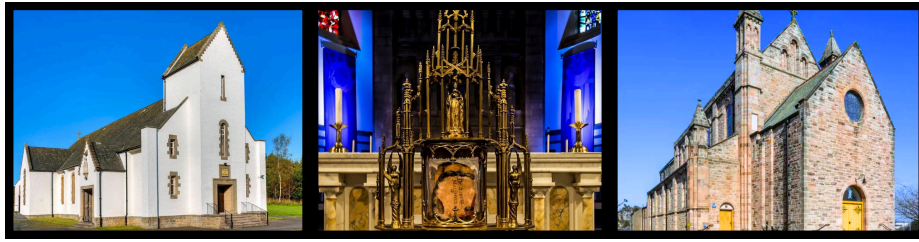

President of Hungary Visit

On Wednesday 28th January, we were honoured with a private visit by the President of Hungary, Tamás Sulyok and his wife. Archbishop Leo Cushley welcomed the President to St Margaret's.

The President was accompanied by a delegation from the Hungarian Consulate. St Margaret's Relic was the highlight of the visit, with Archbishop Cushley leading prayers in the Lady Chapel. During his visit, the President emphasised the strong, over one thousand year history between Hungary and Scotland through the life and legacy of St Margaret.

The President kindly presented a beautiful gift to the Parish to mark his visit which Archbishop Cushley accepted on our behalf.

Tamás Sulyok wrote on Facebook: *"In Dunfermline, Scotland, we paid our respects at the tomb of Margaret, who was born on Hungarian soil, descended from English and Hungarian royalty, and canonized as Queen of Scotland. Her story exemplifies the momentum of medieval European history, in which the Hungarian Kingdom envisioned by St. Stephen took its first steps amid the power struggles of the continent."*

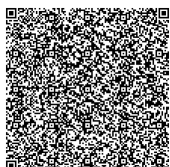

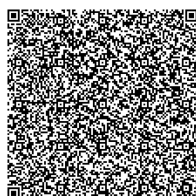

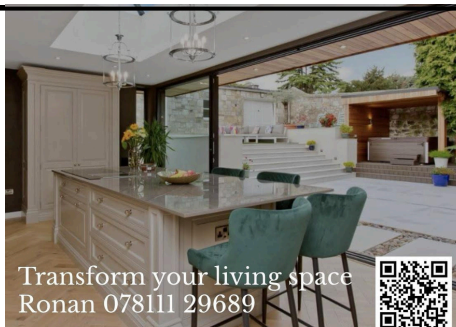

4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – YEAR (A)



FIRST READING Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13

Seek the Lord, all you humble of the land, who do his just commands; seek righteousness; seek humility; perhaps you may be hidden on the day of the anger of the Lord.

I will leave in your midst a people humble and lowly. They shall seek refuge in the name of the Lord, those who are left in Israel; they shall do no injustice and speak no lies, nor shall there be found in their mouth a deceitful tongue. For they shall graze and lie down, and none shall make them afraid.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

Consider your calling, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

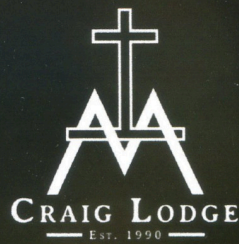
For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.
